In 1906, in St. Paul, MN, American jurist Roscoe Pound delivered a seminal speech to the American Bar Association. In this well-noted address, he carefully described the sources underlying popular dissatisfaction with the administration of justice. Despite the passage of 100 years, popular dissatisfaction with justice and with the legal profession continues and his insights are as highly relevant to the practice of law today as they were at the turn of the 20th century. In the context of Pound's address, this seminar will explore the processes by which we administer justice, public perception of the legal profession, and the personal calling to the practice of law in the 21st century.
