ELDER LAW NEWS AND HIGHLIGHTS

New Lobbyist Registration Requirements Became Effective January 1, 2024

Sweeping new lobbyist registration requirements became effective January 1, 2024. Although most Elder Law attorneys might not consider themselves "lobbyists," if an attorney is paid \$3,000 or more in a year to attempt to influence a board that includes local elected officials regarding spending or investments of public funds, the new registration requirements would apply. You might be surprised to find that you are considered a lobbyist subject to registration without realizing it.

At the request of the League of Minnesota Cities and various other entities that lobby at the State Capitol regarding legislative proposals that affect various units of local government, the Board has issued Advisory Opinion #456, which is available at: https://cfb.mn.gov/pdf/advisory_opinions/AO456.pdf?t=1704382682.

The Minnesota State Bar Association requested an Advisory Opinion regarding a number of common real estate situations where an attorney might be representing individuals or organizations before a local board or committee that includes local elected officials.
