ELDER LAW NEWS

Recent DHS Administrative Decision Appealed

I met with Linda and Sue in 2017. They were partners and had lived together at Sue's home in Wright County since 1980. They had very modest means and both were on MA. Sue believed Linda had earned the right to co-own their home due to Linda's financial contributions towards the property's expenses for 37 years. I prepared a Deed by which Sue gave Linda a joint tenancy interest in their home. In 2018, Sue's health dramatically declined and she moved into a nursing home. Linda immediately applied for LTC MA on Sue's behalf. Wright County denied the application for LTC MA, pointing to the Deed as an uncompensated transfer.

On administrative appeal, the DHS Appeals Division found there was no uncompensated transfer based on Linda's contributions to the property expenses over the years and reversed Wright County's determination of ineligibility.
