IRS Annual Inflation Adjustments for 2022

The IRS has released the annual inflation adjustments for 2022:

The federal estate tax exclusion is \$12,060,000.

The annual gift tax exclusion is \$16,000 per donee, or \$164,000 for gifts to spouses who are not U.S. citizens.

The maximum reduction for real property under the special valuation method is \$1,230,000.

The contribution limit has increased from \$19,500 to \$20,500 for employees who take part in 401(k), 403(b), most 457 plans, and the federal government's Thrift Savings Plan.

The annual limit on contributions to an IRA remains unchanged at \$6,500.

Southern Minnesota Regional Legal Services (SMRLS) – Call for Volunteers

Southern Minnesota Regional Legal Services (SMRLS) is experiencing an increase in pro bono requests in the area of probate and estate law. SMRLS serves the 33 counties of southern Minnesota, including the east and south metro. Available and ongoing opportunities for probate and trust lawyers are as follows:

Probate cases: SMRLS has an increased need for a network of pro bono attorneys willing to assist clients with formal unsupervised probate and affidavits of collection and survivorship. SMRLS assists clients who are at risk of losing their housing. Typically, clients are family members of a person who died intestate and owned a home where the client lived. The client needs the home in his or her name to access low-income housing repair loans or resolve other issues with a city or county. The home is typically the family's only asset and is of limited value. SMRLS is seeing a large increase in these cases. Occasionally the home has a Medical Assistance Lien against it, and the client usually files under an IFP. SMRLS is also able to reimburse filing fees. Most volunteers spend 12-15 hours over the course of several months on these cases. Volunteer attorneys need to have some experience with probate, but SMRLS can provide access to mentor volunteer attorneys and a training packet. SMRLS has two volunteer coordinators to provide support for attorneys doing pro bono, malpractice insurance for volunteers, and CLE credit for pro bono hours.

<u>Wills</u>: SMRLS offers wills clinics 1-2 times a year where volunteer attorneys and clerks draft simple wills, HCDs, POAs, and TODDs. Outside of the clinics, SMRLS occasionally needs volunteers to draft wills for terminally ill clients who contact us. Although we don't have any current needs, volunteers can still contact us to be added to our list of potential volunteers to contact as needs arise.

<u>Trusts</u>: SMRLS occasionally helps severely disabled clients with special needs trusts.

Guardianship and Person/Centered Planning: SMRLS has an increased need for a network of probono attorneys willing to assist families of disabled individuals with guardianships or other support tools like POAs. SMRLS uses person-centered planning to best serve clients who contact us with a legal need for a supportive decision-making tool and are not able to afford traditional legal services. SMRLS is seeing a large increase in these cases. Most volunteers spend 20-30 hours over the course of several months on these cases. Volunteer attorneys need to have some experience with guardianship or person centered planning, but SMRLS can provide access to mentor volunteer attorneys and a training packet. SMRLS has two volunteer coordinators to provide support for attorneys doing pro bono, malpractice insurance for volunteers, and CLE credit for pro bono hours.
